# PAPI'S & REIL'S

The contractor has ordered the PAPI/REIL equipment and is approximately 8 to 10 weeks out for delivery. During this waiting period, the contractor will be completing field work on the concrete foundations/base pads along with the electrical feeds. The Electrical Equipment Room is concurrently under construction and awaiting equipment deliveries that have a shorter delivery schedule. After the PAPI/REIL equipment arrives there will be about a 2 week installation period. Overall, current projection is that the PAPIs & REILs will be on-line by summer.

Once the system is installed the FAA will fly the PAPI system to ensure it meets their criteria. It seems that airport users will find this to be a welcome improvement.

Another change being considered is to update the runway lighting control system to avoid triggering the lights during daylight hours and to implement the ability to turn the PAPI and REIL's on only when needed, day or night. The savings in power and wear and tear on bulbs and transformers will lower costs and increase reliability for those times when they are really needed.

"There's always that little bit of fulfilling a dream in flying," he said. "I told my kids when we used to go flying, that in all of time and all of history, people have only been able to fly in the last 100 years, and you're one of them. That's something we don't appreciate sometimes, the ability to do that, the freedom to do that."


