Runway Closures:

The KBDN runway will closed from about the 7th of September to the 16th. There will be a second, shorter, closure in October to finish the job.

The Troudale (KTTD) runway will be closed from July 11th to the 22nd. On reopening there will be many changes to the runway, taxiways, lighting, signage, markings, etc. Study the new airport diagram the next time you head to KTTD.


Fly-out:
